

Abstract style

The abstract should briefly describe the work to be discussed at the Conference and give a concise summary of the findings.

The abstract should be written in English, 1500-2000 characters without spaces, single spaced, Calibri, with margins 2.5 cm on all sides.

Abstract shorter or exceeding required length will be rejected without assessment.

The title should appear first, in bold capitals, 14 points and left-aligned. A single-line space should remain after the title.

All authors should be listed, in bold, 14 points and left-aligned. The presenting author should be underlined. A single-line space should remain after authors' names.

The authors' institutional affiliations, including department, institution, city, area code and country should then follow, in italics, 11 points and left-aligned. The corresponding author e-mail should be then given also in italics, 11 points and left-aligned. A double-line space should remain after authors' data.

Main text should be written in 11 points, justified. Indentation in the first line of the second paragraph should be equal 0.5. A single-line space should remain after the text.

Keywords should be written in 10 points and listed according to the alphabetical order.

The abstract should not include diagrams, tables and references.
