


## Welcome

It has one of Europe's youngest populations – half of its citizens are less than 35 years old. It also enjoys a steady economy – it is one of the very few European countries which has a positive increase of GDP. Moreover, Poland, together with Ukraine, was a host of the European Football Championships in June 2012.









## Living in Poznań

Poznań is an exciting city with many faces — a major business and academic center (135,000 students, the whole population of Poznań is 551,000) as well as a place rich in historical heritage, varied cultural life and leisure opportunities. The city is located in Western Poland, halfway between Warsaw and Berlin (only 3 hours by train to Berlin and to Warsaw). It is the capital of the region of Wielkopolska — the historical cradle of Polish nationality and one of the most economically developed regions of Poland. The city is also well known for the Poznań International Fair, which hosts 50 international fair events in a variety of fields and industries every year.

Poznań has a lively cultural scene with many theatres, clubs, museums, galleries, an opera house and the State Philharmonic Hall. One of the most famous and most visited festivals is the Malta International Theatre Festival – the second largest in Europe, held every year in June and July.

Poznań also has a lot of green areas – numerous parks, a beautiful Botanical Garden, two zoos and a Palm House, Poland's largest conservatory. There are four lakes in the city which are used for water sports and leisure activities. Not far from the city center there is a dry ski slope.

Poznan offers also a wide variety of other cultural events including film and theatre festivals, various exhibitions including an annual exhibition of modern art, music festivals and many more. Tickets for students are discounted and they cost around 8 euro.

Students find it difficult to be bored in Poznań. In the evenings they can enjoy their time in numerous bars and pubs. Poznań bars are flexible - no matter what the official closing times are, most bars and pubs will stay open until the last customer leaves. They also offer student discounts and special prices for women. Most night spots are conveniently located around the Old Town Square area which is also close to the University.

#### **Sports and recreation**

Everyone will find something for themselves in Poznań. There are many parks and lakes in and around the city for those who prefer to spend time outdoors. Modern gyms and fitness centres offer a wide choice of classes and activities if you prefer to stay inside. Whether you want to take yoga classes or learn to ski, play football, golf or try horse riding, you can find it all in Poznań.

Nowadays, one of the most popular places where people exercise is Lake Malta. It's a man-made lake that was created in 1952. In the summer, Malta is visited by those who enjoy walking, those who skate or rollerblade, those who want to take a break from the city's hustle and bustle, or those who like to go for their jog early in the morning, catching the first rays of sun. In the area surrounding the lake you can find an ice-rink, ski slope and recently opened Maltese Baths, which include 11 pools, Aqualand with 12 water slides and 11 saunas.



#### **Shopping**

There are over fifteen big shopping malls in Poznań, where you can find basically all you need, whether it's a Burberry bag or swimming goggles. The most popular malls are the award-winning Stary Browar, Malta, Plaza and M1. If you're a book lover, Empik will solve your problem as they have a wide selection of books in Polish and English.

As for the souvenirs, Polish glass, amber, lace and woodwork are the most praised products and easily recognizable symbols of Poland. Cepelia is the best known chain of shops selling traditional Polish folk art and handicrafts.

There are also many open-air markets where you can find fresh fruit, vegetables, meat, flowers and much more. At the weekends, Stara Rzeźnia flea market is the right place to go. You can buy second-hand goods, like clothes, books, electronic appliances, as well as antiques and brica-brac.



#### **Residential life**

The University offers its students self-catering accommodation in its three halls of residence. They are located not far from the city center, and are well linked with the University by public transportation. All the buildings have recently been refurbished. Most of the rooms are double and equipped with a high-speed Internet connection. Foreign students are guaranteed to be offered a place in one of the University's halls of residence.

#### Money

Coming to study in a foreign country is a considerable expense and you need to think carefully and count all your expenses before you come. Students who arrive without the necessary funds often find that they have to quit their studies and return home. Please remember that failure to pay the tuition fees on time may result in paying additional statutory interest.

#### Useful tips concerning money

You will need to bring some money with you to cover the initial expenses and then open your own account (preferably in euros). Most banks offer accounts for students with various discounts and bank officials speak English. The documents you need to open an account are:

- your passport,
- your visa or
- residency card.

Please remember to use your student ID to get discounts in cinemas, bus and train tickets.

#### **Health insurance**

You should make sure that you have adequate medical insurance to cover medical costs if you are ill — you can either renew the policy you bought before coming to Poznań or choose among the offers from Polish insurance companies.

#### **Medical Care**

EU-citizens can use any public health centres (marked with NFZ sign) for free on the basis of European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) issued in their home country and some identification document.

Non-EU citizens can use private health centres. They have to cover the costs of medical care an apply for a refund from their insurance company.

#### Residence card

All students are asked to apply for a residence card (permit for a definite period of time) and they need to bring a copy of the residency card to the CSE office every time they renew it. The office will provide you with the confirmation of the student status necessary for the application.

While applying for granting the permit to reside for a definite period of time, you are obliged to file: 1) a filled-in application form concerning the granting of the permit to reside for a definite period of time; 2) 4 up-to-date photographs of the applicant, undamaged, colored, 35 x 45 mm, made in the past 6 months on a plain white background, with good focus and clearly showing the eyes and face from the top of the head to the top of the shoulders, so it occupies 70-80% of the photograph. Photographs are to provide a person without a hat and dark glasses, looking straight ahead with eyes open, face shall be exposed, with the natural expression and closed mouth. A person with congenital or acquired defects of

the eyes may be wearing glasses with dark lenses, a person wearing headgear in accordance with the principles of their religion - with photographs of her headgear. Headgear may not cover or distort the contours of your face;

3) documents that are necessary to confirm the data as contained in the application form and the circumstances that justify applying for granting the permit to reside for a definite period of time; 4) confirmation of making the payment of the stamp duty.

The foreigner shall file the application at least 1 day before the lapse of the stay period under the visa or of the period up to which the previous permit to reside for a definite period of time and if the application fulfills all of the formal requirements, the competent authority shall affix a stamp in your travel document, which confirms that the application has been made and your stay on the Polish territory is legal until the final decision is made.

#### Nostrification of the high school leaving diploma

- I. The nostrification is made by Chief Education Officer respectively for the residence place of the person applying for nostrification and in case of the lack of such a place Chief Education Officer respectively for the residence place of the institution in which the applicant intends to submit the certificate. II. To nostrificate the certificate an applicant is obliged to submit the following:
- 1. An application for nostrification together with a statement that the submitted certificate has not been nostrificated previously in Poland.
- 2. The original certificate or its duplicate authorized by:
- a Polish Consul in the country where the school is located or
- a Polish Consul in the country in which educational system the school operates, or
- a diplomatic mission or a consulate accredited in Poland in which educational system the school operates, or in which the process of education has been carried out.
- 3. If a school leaving certificate has been issued by an institution working in an educational system of the country participating in Hague Convention of 5th October 1961 (Law Gazette 112 of 2005 position 938 and 939), the legalization is


carried out in a form of "Apostille" placed in the document or attached to it.

4. Original translations of the documents enumerated in point 1, 2 made or confirmed by the certified translator included in the list of translators of the Ministry of Justice or a Polish consul in the country where the document has been issued.

Attention: The translation must be based on the original certificate. If the certificate has been issued in a language with an alphabet different than Latin, the copy of the document should be enclosed to the translation.

5. A document confirming identity (ID, passport, residence permit).




# Poznań University of Economics and Business



#### Students' documents

Every student in Poland receives a document confirming their status as a student of a university, which is "legitymacja" (student ID)

You will receive the document in the CSE Office after arrival and payment of 17 PLN.

The Student ID should be carried by you at all times as it allows you access to the University Library

(http://www.biblioteka.ue.poznan.pl/index.php?go=library\_training). Moreover, it enables you to buy e.g. discount tickets for the city's public transportation system and discount tickets to the cinema. The Student ID should be validated every semester in the CSE Office.



#### Types of classes:

- seminars
- -lectures
- classes
- laboratory classes
- field work
- language classes

Credits for lectures or any other types of classes not ending with examinations are earned on the terms and in the form specified by the teacher. After the completion of such course the student is rewarded with a credit ("zal" in their credit book) (Study rules and regulations §22).

During the first class, the teacher is required to present credit requirements and regulations on excusing absence from classes (Study rules and regulations §22).

Dates of tests should be announced to students with two weeks' notice (Study rules and regulations §22).


#### **Examinations**

A student takes an examination only after completing compulsory courses. In the case of paid studies or subjects, an additional requirement is to pay the tuition fee prior to the examination (Study rules and regulations §24).

The exact dates of examinations are set by examiners after hearing students' suggestions (Study rules and regulations §25).

In the event of failing an exam, a student is entitled to take two resit examinations (Study rules and regulations §27).





### **Graduation** procedures

A student writes a diploma (Bachelor's or Master's degree) thesis under the supervision of a professor, a person with a postdoctoral degree, or a person with a doctoral degree authorized by the Faculty Council (Study rules and regulations §37).

A diploma thesis is evaluated by the supervisor and by a reviewer appointed by the Dean (Study rules and regulations §41).

A diploma examination is held before an examination board appointed by the Dean and is oral (Study rules and regulations §42, 44).

The final mark is calculated as follows:

- 1) 60% of the arithmetic mean of all examination and endof-semester marks, including "fail" marks,
- 2) 25% of the diploma thesis mark,
- 3) 15% of the diploma examination mark


(Study rules and regulations §47).

#### **Additional classes**

All Bachelor students are required to take compulsory physical education classes. You can participate in compulsory classes for all students (basketball, football, volleyball, gym, aerobics, swimming, table tennis, Nordic walking) or sign for one of the sections of University's Sports Association.

#### e-UEP Moodle portal

Our University has an e-learning portal called Moodle. The system is available at: http://moodle.ue.poznan.pl/

To log into system you should give your LOGIN (nazwa użytkownika) and PASSWORD (hasło). Your login is a 6-giti number of your student ID (numer albumu). When you log in for the first time you have to complete some obligatory fields — email, your home town (miasto) and country (wybierz kraj). In Moodle you can sign up for a selected course by choosing it from the list and entering the "enrolment key" which will be given to you by a teacher at the first lecture.

#### Health and Safety course (BHP)

Health and Safety course is obligatory for all the students beginning studies at PUEB. It is an

e-learning course delivered through Moodle portal. It consists of materials which you should read and final test. The test consists of 15 questions (8 positive answers are needed to pass). If you fail, you can retake the test two more times.

You have to log into the Moodle portal according to the instructions above. The enrolment key for the course Health and Safety (BHP) – English – dr Katarzyna Lis is: BHP.
