REQUIREMENTS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Exchange students are admitted on the basis of formal agreements between the University of Lethbridge and another post-secondary institution. Students who would like to participate in an exchange program at the University of Lethbridge apply through their home university.

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be enrolled at least in the second year of undergraduate studies at the home university
- · Be in good standing at home university

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT

Exchange students are required to submit an official language certificate, and we ask our partners to ensure students have one of the following before submitting the nomination:

English Language Proficiency assessments (Must have been completed within two years prior to Exchange term)

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT or TOEFL iBT Home Edition)

Minimum score of 76, with minimum scores of 16 in each Listening, Reading, and Speaking, and a minimum score of 18 in Writing

IELTS or IELTS Online

Minimum overall score of 6.0, and a minimum 5.5 in each band.

IELTS One Skill Retake results are accepted

Cambridge English Qualifications

C1 Advanced, with a minimum score of 169, and a minimum 169 in each subscore.

Cambridge English qualifications

B2 First, with a minimum score of 169, and a minimum 169 in each subscore.

Pearson Test of English (PTE)

Academic score with a minimum overall score of 51, with a minimum score of 50 in each part.

Duolingo English Test

Minimum score of 105, with a minimum score of 95 in each of Literacy, Comprehension, and Conversation, and a minimum score of 90 in Production.
