01. WHY POLAND?

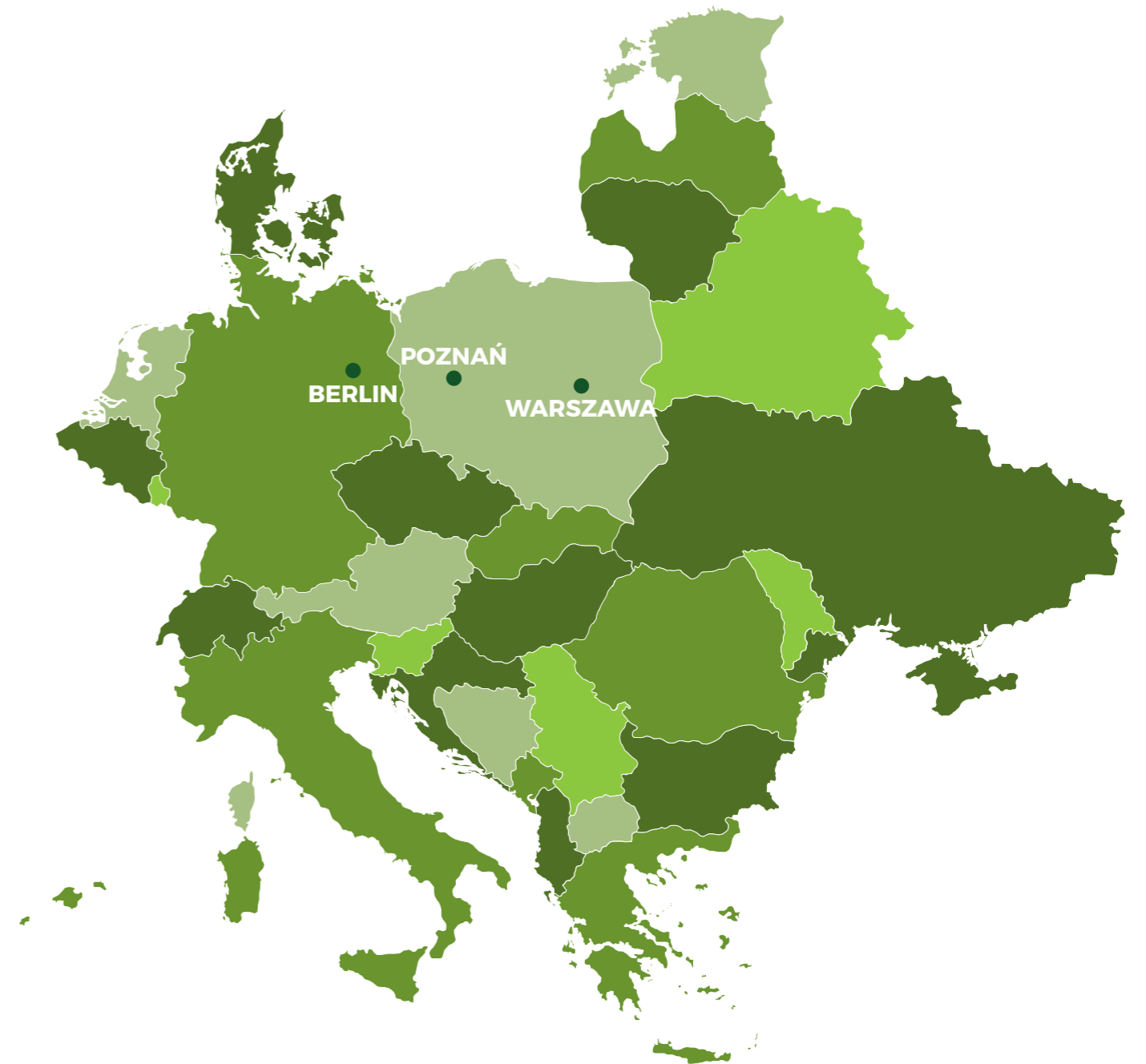

PUEB'S DOCTORAL SCHOOL 06.

The Poznań University of Economics and Business Doctoral School in its current form was established in 2019. The programme lasts for 8 semesters (4 years) and prepares the doctoral students for conducting research, writing doctoral dissertations, their submission and defence. Currently, there are approximately 60 doctoral students pursuing a PhD degree at PUEB.

At PUEB, doctoral dissertations may be written in two disciplines, both belonging to the area of social sciences: economics and finance, or management and quality studies. PhD supervisors support doctoral students preparing dissertations in, among other fields: international business, logistics, management, economics, finance and banking, marketing, social policy and many other areas that fall under economics and business.

A dissertation can be prepared as a collection of articles, or as a traditional thesis.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Our Doctoral School is a full-time programme. Regular classes are held on weekdays (mainly on Wednesdays and on Fridays with some exceptions), starting from the first week of the academic year. Classes run by visiting lecturers may be held on other days, also remotely. Participation in classes is obligatory for all doctoral students.

The total number of classes which are part of the education programme corresponds to 46 ECTS points and 550 instruction hours conducted in the form of lectures, classes, workshops and doctoral seminars. Doctoral students also participate in 45 hours of a professional apprenticeship in the area of teaching.

THE PUEB DOCTORAL SCHOOL STUDY PROGRAMME INCLUDES:

- mandatory courses,
- elective courses, which – having been selected – are mandatory for a doctoral student,
- doctoral seminars,
- doctoral workshops with the presentation of the concept of the doctoral dissertation as a part of the ‘Scientific Research Design 2’ course (2nd semester).
- participation and delivering a paper at a conference of doctoral students organised at PUEB (4th semester),
- mid-semester evaluation in 4th semester,
- professional apprenticeship (classes with Bachelor’s or Master’s degree students).

A doctoral student completes their education with the defence of the doctoral dissertation.

During their studies, PUEB doctoral students acquire unique skills that are crucial to young researchers, such as:

- critical study of research literature,
- designing research and selection of adequate research methods and tools,
- preparation of publications,
- preparation of presentations and public speaking,
- ability to establish research contacts,
- conducting classes.

In each semester there are also lectures and classes held for all the doctoral students of a given year or different years, aimed at integrating the community of doctoral students, e.g. the inauguration lecture at the beginning of an academic year (odd semesters), presentations from the cycle “The Best Doctoral Dissertations at PUEB”, library training (databases, software for bibliography management), training in organising and financing research, lectures by visiting lecturers, workshops developing the so-called transferable skills.

PUEB'S DOCTORAL SCHOOL ADMISSIONS 07.

PUEB Doctoral School candidates must have the M.A., M.Sc., or an equivalent degree, as well as the qualities required for education in a doctoral school, in particular:

- cognitive curiosity,
- interest in economics, finance, management, or quality science in a broad sense,
- ability to notice problems in the fields of economics, finance, management or quality science,
- participation in research or research and development projects during or after studies,
- Knowledge of English at a level not lower than B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Admission to the PUEB Doctoral School is conducted by way of competition, based on points received for research and academic achievements. In order to be eligible for admission, candidates need to collect a minimum of 60 points, including a minimum of 15 points for the PhD concept. The threshold of points needed for admission is different every year and depends on the applicants' achievements.

The Admissions Committee reviews all candidates' applications and calculates qualification points according to the following scheme:

↑ **up to 35 points**
for the PhD concept

↑ **up to 30 points**
for the interview

↑ **up to 20 points**
for research publications

↑ **up to 10 points**
for other achievements
in research and teaching

↑ **5 points**
for a positive recommendation letter

The maximum number of qualification points is 100

ADMISSIONS STEP-BY-STEP

- 1** Create an account and apply online through PUEB's dedicated web page
- 2** Collect all the required documents (your academic portfolio)
- 3** Prepare a PhD concept approved by a PUEB professor
- 4** Submit your documents to PUEB (in person or by post)
- 5** Take the PUEB English language test if needed
- 6** Pass the oral interview
- 7** Wait for the results...



APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

1. Admission application addressed to the Director of the Doctoral School;
2. Personal questionnaire;
3. Scan of a copy of the diploma confirming obtaining a master's degree or equivalent;
4. PhD concept written in English (according to PUEB's template). The PhD must be accepted by a potential academic supervisor from the PUEB;
5. List of the candidate's research and teaching achievements;
6. Cover letter - up to 450 words, including information about candidate's professional experiences and activities concerning designing PhD project, and indicating the potential doctoral dissertation supervisor;
7. At least 1 recommendation letter about the candidate's predispositions and abilities written by the MA thesis supervisor, or by another researcher employed by a university or a scientific research institution
8. Document confirming knowledge of English language at CEFR level min. B2, i.e.:
9. copy of a certificate of the candidate's command of English, or
10. university diploma certifying the knowledge of English, or
11. document certifying the knowledge of English at the required level issued by PUEB (after a test);
12. Certificate of the candidate's change of surname (for candidates with a diploma with a different surname than their current one);
13. Colour digital photograph, in compliance with the requirements for passport photographs - size 20 x 25 mm, resolution 300 DPI, JPEG or TIFF format;
14. Publication in a journal from the current (on the day of the publication) list of scientific journals and materials from international conferences issued by the minister responsible for science and higher education, with the assigned score;
15. Publication in a journal not included in the current list issued by the minister responsible for science and higher education;
16. Participation in a national conference, delivering a paper or presenting a poster;
17. Participation in an international conference, delivering a paper or presenting a poster;
18. Certified participation in an organization of an international scientific conference;
19. Evaluation of the candidate's other achievements in research and teaching (e.g. confirmed involvement in the activity of a science club or active promotion of science).

Candidates who have completed their studies outside Poland need to provide a recognition statement issued by the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange (Narodowa Agencja Wymiany Akademickiej or NAWA), confirming that a candidate's diploma gives the right to access education at the doctoral school in Poland gives the right to submit the application to a doctoral school in Poland.



08. FEES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Doctoral School at Poznań University of Economics is free of charge for all admitted students.

DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIP

Every doctoral student admitted to PUEB (without a previously obtained doctoral degree) receives a doctoral scholarship for the whole duration of the Doctoral School. The total duration of a doctoral scholarship at doctoral schools may not exceed 4 years. This period does not include the period of suspension of training.

The amount of monthly doctoral scholarship in 2024:

- year 1 and 2 - PLN 3,466.90 gross (approx. PLN 3,076.53 net);
- year 3 and 4 after a positive midterm evaluation - PLN 5,340.90 gross (approx. PLN 4,739.51 net).

A doctoral student with a certificate of disability is entitled to receive a doctoral scholarship increased by 30% of the amount indicated above.

ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Doctoral students can also apply for:

- a regular increase of their scholarship (by app 10-15%) for their scientific achievements;
- a one-time Rector's scholarship for best achievements;

Starting from 2024 our best doctoral students may also apply for a special scholarship funded by the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange under the STER-NAWA Program for PUEB's doctoral students (PLN 3,500 gross).



OTHER TYPES OF FUNDING

Obtaining additional funds for research is an extremely important and useful skill for young researchers. At PUEB there are several internal grants for research staff and doctoral students who are interested in participating in competitions, e.g. Mini-grants for conducting research or Fast track to publication.

PhD students may receive additional funding for:

- surveys or other studies enabling the collection of data involving the use of external actors, statistical data processing,
- participation in international or national conferences with presentation of research, R&D or development findings on key research issues,
- purchase of data / materials necessary for the implementation of the research, R&D or development tasks'
- publication fee or open access to publication,
- proofreading at any stage of the publication process.



Starting from 2024 PUEB's doctoral students may also apply for funding their individual research projects, preparation of publications and participation in conferences under the IREG Program (limited to app. PLN 7,000 for a single activity).

Additionally, they can also apply for extra funding for their scientific foreign internships under the STER-NAWA Program (PLN 12,000 monthly for internships conducted in OECD countries).

The Research Office at PUEB offers support in the application process for external research grants. Our doctoral students are currently conducting several research projects funded by the Polish National Science Centre under the Preludium Program, dedicated for PhD students.

Other activities of the Research Office may include, but are not limited to:

- sharing information on research programmes, projects, conferences, training and other initiatives,
- administrative service of research: funds from subsidies for research activities, research projects financed from national and foreign science funding agencies, internal projects and commissioned by economic entities,
- coordinating activities undertaken with regard to PUEB's industrial property protection proceedings and aimed at commercialisation of research findings and R&D work, as well as know-how related to these findings.

VISA AND TEMPORARY RESIDENCE PERMIT 10.

EU/EAA citizens do not need any Polish visa to study in Poznań. However, if stay is longer than three months a temporary residence permit should be obtained. Non-EU/Eaa citizens who arrive in Poland are required to obtain a student's D-type national visa at a Polish Embassy or Consulate in their country of residence. As the decision process takes around 15 days, we advise students to apply for a visa at least two months before the academic year starts (cost about \$89). Please consult the website of the Polish consulate/embassy in your country to find out the details of the process.

The D-type national visa permits to enter the territory of the Republic of Poland and to stay continuously or for several successive times in this territory for a total duration of more than 90 days during the period of validity of the visa, but not longer than one year. It also permits to travel in the territory of other Schengen Area Member States for up to 90 days during a 180-day period, during the validity period of the visa.



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR VISA APPLICATION

The Applicant shall present the original and a photocopy of each document with the visa application.

1. Visa application form filled via the online e-konsulat system, printed and signed;
2. A 3.5 x 4.5 cm colour photo. The photo must be:
 - a. sharp, taken against white background and printed on a quality paper,
 - b. newer than 6 months,
 - c. taken en face, clearly showing the eyes and face on both sides from the top of the head to the top of the shoulders with the face covering 70-80% of the photo. The photo must be taken without any headwear.
3. Passport issued within last ten years, valid for at least three months from the expected return date, with at least two blank pages for visas.
4. A copy of the passport page with personal data and the photo.
5. A medical travel insurance whose coverage amounts to not less than EUR 30,000, and covering all expenses that may arise in connection with the need to return for medical reasons, a medical emergency, urgent hospitalisation or death, or Polish National Health Fund medical insurance,
6. A copy of an ID document to confirm legal residence within the consular district of your application.
7. Proof that you have enough means of subsistence in the form decided by the mission.
 - a. A valid bank account statement issued by your bank,
 - b. A valid credit card with a certificate of means available,
 - c. A valid income certificate from your employer for the last three months,
 - d. Traveller's cheques issued to the visa applicant - an original and a copy.
8. A proof of accommodation (for example, an official invitation or a hotel booking or reservation).
9. Documents confirming the purpose of your stay Poland.
10. Additional documents required by the Polish Consulate in the given country.

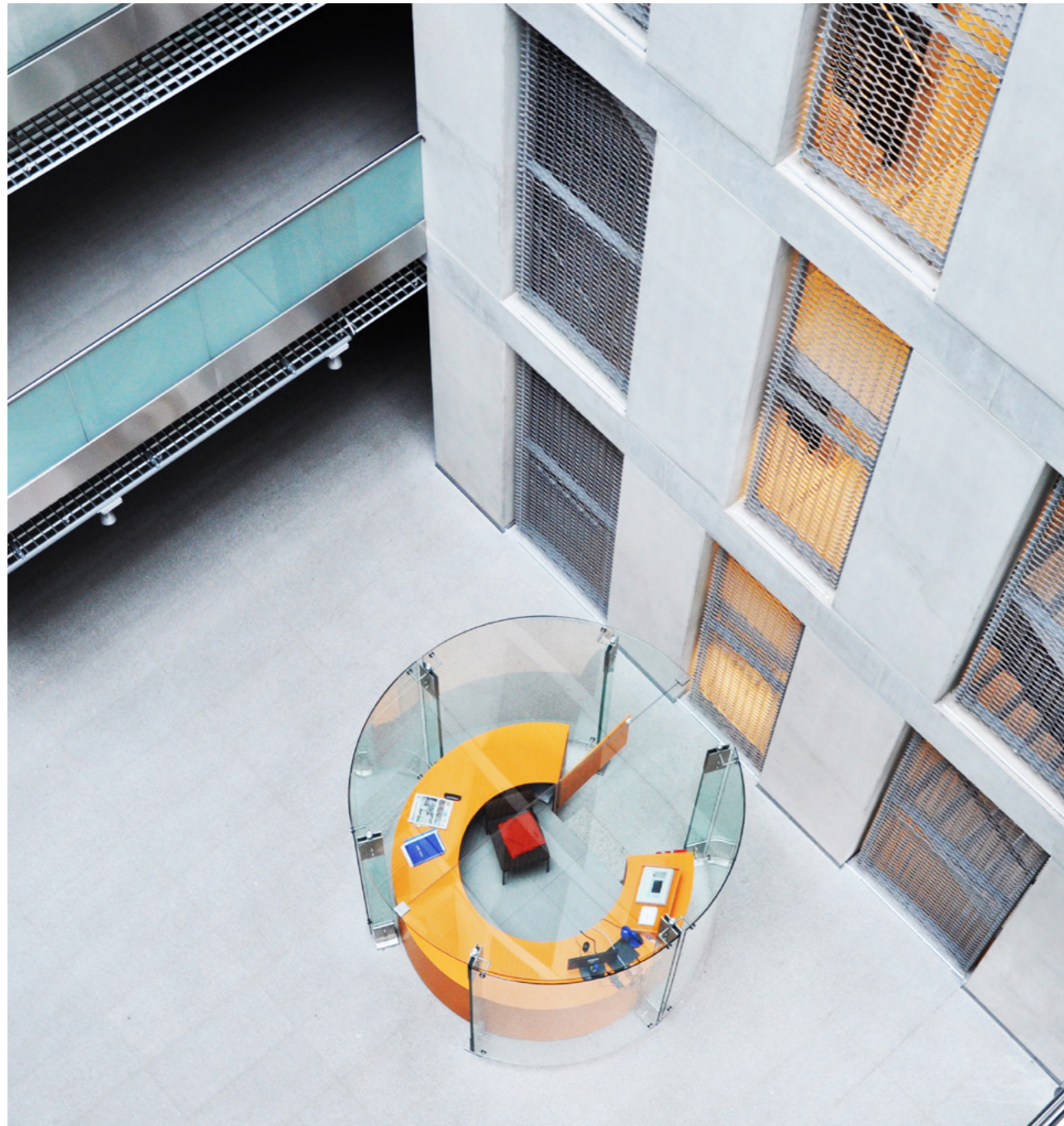

TIPS FOR WHEN APPLYING FOR A VISA

1. Make sure you apply for the correct type of visa (national D type visa);
2. Remember to book an appointment through e-consulate at least 6 weeks before you plan to travel to Poland;
3. Make sure you have all the required documents as listed on the Embassy's webpage;
4. Remember not to send representatives and to arrive on time;
5. Prepare for the interview (make sure you know all the details about your chosen course of studies, why you want to study in Poland and at this particular university; think about how you will profit from the studies in the future).



TEMPORARY RESIDENCE PERMIT

After arriving in Poland, international students typically need to apply for a residence permit to legally stay in the country for the duration of their studies.

TRC APPLICATION - REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

1. A filled out application form;
2. A photocopy of your passport (original needs to be shown);
3. A proof of payment of the stamp duty - 340 PLN;
4. 4 biometric PHOTOS (face front, not older than 6 months);
5. A current proof of valid health insurance;
6. A current documents confirming financial resources;
7. A current confirmation letter from university (in Polish) including information on the student status and tuition fee payments;
8. A filled in and signed declaration regarding housing costs.

For first year students, the permits are granted for the period of 15 months. Subsequent years' students, may receive the temporary residence permit for the remaining period of studies, extended by 3 months however in any case not exceeding 3 years. After completing the studies, graduates can apply for a temporary residence permit for a graduate looking for work or planning to establish an economic activity. This temporary residence permit is granted for the period of 9 months.



11. HEALTH INSURANCE

All foreign students in Poland are required to have health insurance.

International students who come from non-European countries have, in most cases, a private insurance which was required for the visa application. But this insurance covers mostly only accidents and does not cover general practitioner's consultations. PUEB students can choose to join the Polish National Health Fund (NFZ) or to obtain insurance from a private health insurance.

Private insurance plans for international students in Poland are available from various insurance providers and offer broader coverage, including access to private hospitals and clinics, emergency medical evacuation, and repatriation services. Students should carefully review the coverage and terms of private insurance plans to ensure they meet their healthcare needs while studying in Poland.

It may be more affordable to apply for a general medical care insurance (Voluntary Health Insurance for Students from Foreign Countries). You can register at the Poznań NFZ branch (National Health Fund – in Polish: Narodowy Fundusz Zdrowia). You will need to print and complete two copies of the NFZ Health Insurance Coverage application, prepare your passport, valid student card, student confirmation letter from PUEB and a document confirming residency in Poland (if you live in a dormitory, you will need the certificate of living in the dormitory, and if you live in an apartment, you will need a copy of your residential lease agreement).



12. ACCOMMODATION

There are various accommodation options for students in Poznań. Here are the most popular ones:

1. The University offers its students self-catering accommodation in its three halls of residence, named "Feniks", "Atol" and "Dewizka". They are located not far from the city centre, and are well linked with the University by public transportation. All the buildings have recently been refurbished. Most of the rooms are double and equipped with Internet connection.
2. In addition to university dormitories, there are private student residences in Poznań that cater to international students. These residences offer a range of accommodation options, including shared apartments and studio apartments. Private student residences may offer amenities such as furnished rooms, communal spaces, internet access, and laundry facilities.
3. Many PUEB students opt to rent private apartments or rooms in Poznań. Renting a private apartment or room allows students more flexibility in terms of location, amenities, and living arrangements. There are various online platforms and real estate agencies that can assist students in finding suitable rental accommodation in Poznań.

It is essential for new PUEB students to explore their accommodation options well in advance and consider factors such as location, cost, amenities, and personal preferences.
